

Regulation "Der weisse Rausch"

- 1) With the acceptance of the start number the waiver of liability is fully accepted.
- 2) The start must be made from the assigned starting block. Starting from a wrong starting block will result in disqualification.
- 3) The start number must be worn clearly visible. Concealment of the start number by overclothing, backpacks etc lead to disqualification.
- 4) Wearing a helmet is obligatory.
- 5) The transponder, which is attached to the start number, must be returned before leaving the finish area. The participant is responsible to check if the transponder is properly attached to the start number. Any complaints must be made known directly when the start numbers are received. Transponders that are not returned will be charged with a fee of 50 Euro.
- 6) During the race the 10 FIS rules are valid.
- 7) All instructions of the marshals must be followed.
- 8) Should a marshal wave the yellow flag, the speed must be reduced immediately and be ready to brake.
- 9) The participant is obliged to cross the finish line with all the sports equipment. The equipment may not be changed during the race. All equipment that was carried at the start must also be brought across the finish line. Failure to do so will result in disqualification.
- 10) The direction gates must be passed between the outer poles.
- 11) Grace period: All participants who have not yet passed the gate at the Tanzboden valley station at 6:00 p.m. will be taken out of the race. This means that those participants will be on the course at their own risk and without any claim to a rescue organized by the organizer.
- 12) The race "Der weisse Rausch" is held in the spirit of community and sportsmanship. Should the spirit of sport be violated by a participant, this will lead to disqualification.

A court of arbitration decides on disqualifications, these decisions are binding and cannot be appealed.

The court of arbitration consists of one representative each of the Arlberger Bergbahnen, the Tourist Association St. Anton am Arlberg and the Ski Club Arlberg.
